2R guide dots

NATIONAL REPUBLIC 2R RED BROWN

Issued early 1920 Sheets of 135 (9 horizontal rows of 15, Printing 1), 150 (10 horizontal rows of 15, Printings 2 and 3), 132 (11 horizontal rows of 3, Printing 4), 144 (12 horizontal rows of 12, Printing 5).

Printing plate produced from transfer blocks of 10: A B C D E (part transfer blocks at right F G H I J and base start with A etc).

I is usually identifiable by a white dot $2\mathsf{mm}$ below the second G of GEORGIE.

Printing 1 White Paper. Imperf. Guideline at sides (row 5).
Top and bottom markings unknown.

Printing 2 Newsprint. Imperf. Circle and dots guidelines top and bottom (row 8).

Printing 3 Newsprint. Perf $11\frac{1}{2}$. Circle and dots guidelines top and bottom (row 8).

Printing 4 Newsprint. Perf $11\frac{1}{2}$. Circle and dots guidelines at top and bottom (between rows 6 and 7) and at sides (row 6).

Printing 5
Newsprint. Imperf. Small circles guidelines at sides (between rows 6 and 7). Circles and guidelines at foot.
In the freak printing the inscription and value are inverted in positions 27 and 39.

NATIONAL REPUBLIC 3R DULL BLUE

Issued early 1920

Sheets of 130 (10 horizontal rows of 13, Printings 1 and 2), 144 (12 horizontal rows of 12, Printings 3 to 6), 156 (12 horizontal rows of 13, Printing 7).

Printing plate produced from transfer block of 10:

ABCDE

FGHIJ

Printing 7

Unlike other values, the block appears to have been reformed. On printings 1 to 3 a constant variety occurs on stamp G - a hook on Tamara's head. On printings 4 to 7 this occurs on stamp I, and the vertically adjacent stamp D has a diagonal line missing from top left to bottom right. Imperf?

White Paper. Perf 111. Circle at sides (between Printing 1 rows 5 and 6). Circle at top and bottom (row 7). Rare.

Newsprint. Perf $ll \frac{1}{2}$. Circle at sides (between rows 5 and 6). Circle at top and bottom (row 7). Printing 2

Newsprint. Perf $11\frac{1}{2}$. Circle at sides (between rows 5 and 6). Circle at top and bottom (row 7). Printing 3

Newsprint. Imperf. Circle at sides (between rows 6 and 7). Nothing at top and bottom. Printing 4

Newsprint. Imperf. Circle and bars at sides (between Printing 5 rows 6 and 7). Top and bottom unknown. It is only assumed that this setting is of 144 stamps, as complete sheets have not het been seen by us.

Newsprint. Imperf. No marginal markings. Printing 6


> White Paper. Perf 111. Circle at sides (between rows 6 and 7). Circle at top and bottom (row 7). In the freak printing the inverted "5" occurs on stamp no.78.

NATIONAL REPUBLIC 5R ORANGE-YELLOW

Issued early 1920 Sheets of 120 (10 horizontal rows of 12, Printing 2), 144 (12 horizontal rows of 12 later printings). The layout of the first printing is unknown. Printing plate produced from transfer block of 10:

A B C D E (part transfer blocks at right or F G H I J bottom start with A etc).

Printing 1 Newsprint. Imperf. Circle and bars guideline at top (row 6 or 7?). Others unknown.

Printing 2 Newsprint. Perf $11\frac{1}{2}$. Circle and bars guidelines at top (row 6).

Printing 3 Newsprint. Perf $11\frac{1}{2}$. Circle and bars guidelines at sides (between rows 3 and 6).

Printing 5 Newsprint. Perf $11\frac{1}{2}$. Circle and bars guidelines at sides (between rows 6 and 7). Star at top (between rows 6 and 7). Circle at foot (between rows 6 and 7).

<u>Printing 6</u> White Paper? Imperf. Circle guideline at sides (between rows 6 and 7), top and bottom blank.

Printing 7 White Paper. Imperf. Circle guideline at sides (between rows 6 and 7). Circle and bars guidelines at top and bottom (row 6).

The freak printing "Tamara asleep" is stamp no.81.



NATIONAL GUARD OVERPRINT

Typographed overprint in five lines in black. Intended for issue on 12 December 1920 at double face value, half for postage, the remainder for the National Guard. In the event the advance of Soviet troops prevented all but possibly the 3R value from being sold in this way.


DE JURE OVERPRINT

Typographed overprint in four lines in black. Intended for issue in Tiflis on 27 January 1921 to mark the "de jure" recognition of the National Democratic Republic of Georgia by the Versailles . Peace Conference. Only the 2R to 5R were actually issued before Soviet troops entered the city on 25 February.



27 January 1921 Final printings (imperf, with or without gum) or New printings (2R to 5R) overprinted.
On some values, the freak printings were used for this overprint.

A STATA BERTON CONTROL OF THE

"DE JURE" OVERPRINT - FORGERIES

The main difference is in the final letter of the second and third lines (large format 2R to 5R of the third line only). Shades also vary considerably.

Typographed surcharge in various colours. Issued for courier mail between the Georgian Consulate in Constantinople and Georgia from January 1921 until the Consulate closed on 26 February.

Numbers overprinted are indicated in brackets.

Whether or net these stamps were ever genuinely used is open to question. On the one hand Romeko stated in 1927 that they had proof of genuine usage, whereas at the other extreme there are reports of "thousands" of extra imperf copies having been surcharged by the Consul after his flight from the Consulate. If further imperforate copies were produced "posthumously", few of them survive today, as both perforate and imperforate sets are scarce. The Georgian Consul in Constantinople stated in 1921 that only about ten imperforate sets were prepared at that time, and the overprint cliches were then destroyed.

Covers exist bearing these stamps with Constantinople cancels, some of which bear forged Tiflis arrival cancels. (No premium for covers with forged cancels). A cover with a genuine Tiflis arrival cancel sold for US \$1000 in 1968 and was offered again in 1980 with a valuation of \$2000 (current equivalent £900). A similar cover is reported sent from Constantinople to Tiflis with arrival cancel and 20k postage due marking. This cover sold for \$1200. The postage due marking suggest that the Consular surcharge was disallowed by the Georgian authorities.
