

The Postal Rates of the Protectorate of Bohemia Moravia 1939 - 1945

A study of the postal rates and fees of the Protectorate of Bohemia Moravia, formed from part of Nazi occupied Czechoslovakia on March 16, 1939

This exhibit presents a comprehensive study of the postal rates and special service fees in effect in the Protectorate of Bohemia Moravia from German Occupation on March 16, 1939 through Russian Liberation on May 9, 1945.

Protectorate postal rates, as with most countries, were driven by the various "Postal Unions" to which they belonged for the rating and exchange of mails between members. These include both the UPU as well as other formal and informal Conventions and Ententes.

The presentation of rates within this exhibit is based upon the progression of "Postal Unions" to which it belonged:

Mar 1939 through Oct 1940:

Inheritance of Existing Czech Domestic, Postal Union and Air Mail Rates

Mar 1939 through May 1945:


Retention of Local Special Matter Rates and Fees

Jul 1939 through Oct 1940: Jan 1942 through Jan 1943: Germanification of rates under the German Reich "Postal Union" (Germany and Occupations)

Creation of the Europatariff "Postal Union" (Germany and Occupations, Axis and Friendlies)

While the availability of postal services during the war were influenced by the changing occupation and alliance status of the various countries, the underlying rates for these services were governed by their membership in these various postal unions. Airmail rates are also fully integrated into this structure, including LATI and Pan Am transatlantic mails. Rates to countries not part of these unions was governed by the UPU. This exhibit does not include money order, parcel post, telegraph or telephone as their complex rate structures have far too many steps and changes.


